- Emily Batty, known as Miss B in memory of my Y6 teacher Miss V
- First Class degree in Egyptology from the University of Liverpool
- Reception teaching assistant in central London
- Taught English in Singapore to children and adults
- PGCE (teacher training) at the University of Cambridge (EYFS specialism)
- Museum Education placement at National Art Gallery in London and Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge
- Awarded Charles Fox award at Cambridge for 'Outstanding Contributions'
- Began teaching at Thriplow September 2018
- Completed Masters Degree with distinction in 'Researching Teaching Practice' in 2020 at the University of Cambridge
- EYFS, Art and History Lead at Thriplow
- Mentor to EYFS trainee teachers at the University of Cambridge





- 1. An adult will **<u>auietly and calmly explain</u>** to the child that the behaviour is not appropriate.
- 2. They will explain why, with explicit reference to the Thriplow School Values.
- 3. The adult and the child will then **<u>discuss a better way of behaving</u>** next time.
- 4. The child will be explicitly **praised** when they are seen to have made a positive change .





What are the values in Ants Class?

- Home-school relationships
- Child-centred approach to teaching
- Children are active participants in their learning
- Development of children's agency
- Children's right to make choices and decisions
- Children are capable of initiating their own learning
- Adults act as facilitators of learning

How does learning happen in Ants Class?

- Learning is play-based
- Whole class carpet sessions
- Small group sessions
- One-to-one sessions
- Child-led exploration of the classroom



What is playful learning time?

- Exploration of the resources provided in our room and class garden
- Continuous Provision
 - Resources and the classroom/garden layout designed and curated by class teacher in order to engage, support, and challenge the children in their playful learning
- Enhanced provision
 - The continuous provision is changed, developed and added to by classroom adults, creating further opportunities for challenge and consolidation.
- Adults act as guides, building upon and enriching children's self-directed play and learning.
- Classroom adults are confident to adapt their teaching in order to follow children's individual interests as they arise, using a "planning in the moment" approach.

Welcome to Ants, the Reception Class at Thriplow. We are also known as the 'Early Years Foundation Stage' (EYFS). The adults who teach in Ants are Miss B, Mrs Maloney, Mrs Watson and Mrs Symmons.



In our classroom, we enable our children to learn using a child-centred approach to teaching. This means that we place each individual child at the very heart of the learning process, ensuring children are active participants and that classroom adults support the development of children's agency. Our child-centred approach involves recognising and ensuring that our children have a right to make choices and decisions, and that children are capable of initiating their own learning with adults acting as facilitators of learning.

The children's learning in Ants Class is primarily **play-based**, and this happens through daily adultchild whole class carpte sessions, small group sessions, one-to-one sessions and child-led exploration of the classroom. The focal points of our main learning sessions include Phonics. Literacy, Maths, Physical Development, Handwriting, Religious Education, Understanding the World, Expressive Arts and Design, French and Personal, Social and Emotional Development. 
