What is the Cornerstone Classroom Project?

The Cornerstone Classroom Project is a refurbishment and extension of the main school building at Thriplow C of E Primary School. It will provide desperately needed classroom space for the existing pupils who are currently being taught in temporary areas.

The project will:

- Provide two new permanent classrooms to replace the existing make-shift facilities
- Expand the school's library and S.T.E.M. provision
- Provide a dedicated music room for individual music lessons
- Expand the toilet and cloakroom facilities
- Increase the staffroom provision to include a functional workspace

How will the Project be funded?

The project is estimated to cost approximately £350,000 (pending detailed budget costing).

Generous donations have already been received from the Daffodil Weekend Trust, School House Trustees, Ladybird Playgroup & Thriplow School PTA and to date, we have received or been promised the amazing sum of £68,000 (includes pledged funds).

But there is still work to do! Further donations are being sought from grant foundations, local and national businesses as well as the local community and friends of the school.

Why is the Project necessary?

Thriplow C of E Primary is an academically successful school within the Academy Diocese Trust (DEMAT) and is at the heart of the village community. The school provides a broad, exciting and rigorous educational programme where the national curriculum is not just met but exceeded. In addition to their school based learning, the children are supported with educational visits, a wide range of sporting activities, and music, drama, language and KAPLA lessons, as being provided as with the opportunity to develop their skills in the dedicated Wildspace area. Over and above all this, Thriplow children are encouraged to look beyond the school gates and 'make a difference' to the wider world.

A popular choice among prospective parents, the school has expanded since 2016 from four classes to six, the increased demand provide from both its catchment and neighbouring The school areas. now at capacity and the new building project will provide desperately needed classroom space for existing pupils, replacing the small temporary areas in what was the old staffroom and an administration area. Furthermore, the new building project will enable the school to expand its music, library and S.T.E.M. facilities to meet the high aspirations that the staff have for the children in their care.
